Recommendation of the Academic Policy Committee (APC) to Amend UWM Policies & Procedures Chapter A1.1: Academic Policy Committee

A1.1 Academic Policy Committee

(1) <u>Membership</u>. Seventeen members as follows: <u>eight_seven_elected Faculty</u> members; <u>one University Staff member</u>; three students <u>including at least one</u> <u>graduate student and one undergraduate student</u>; one appointed academic advisor; the Chairs, or their Faculty designees, of the Academic Program and Curriculum Committee and the Graduate Faculty Committee; the Registrar or their designee; and ex-officio: the Dean of one college appointed annually on a rotating basis by the Chancellor, and the Secretary of the University or their designee. The academic advisor is appointed by the Chancellor upon recommendation of the Academic Staff Committee. <u>Student memberships-No more than three elected faculty members may be from the same college.</u> <u>include a student member on the Graduate Faculty Committee</u>, an undergraduate student, and another student who is an officer of the Student Association. No more than two students or no more than three elected Faculty members may be from the same college.

(2) <u>Functions</u>

- a) On its own initiative and/or in cooperation with other Faculty committees, represents student interests and concerns in problems of educational policy which are within the purview of the University Faculty. Educational policy includes but is not limited to, grading system, add/drop policy and the academic year calendar. (Matters of academic program and curriculum are within the jurisdiction of the Academic Program and Curriculum Committee.)
- b) <u>Studies and mMakes</u> recommendations to UWM Administration, the University Faculty or the Faculty Senate, or other appropriate Faculty committees concerning academic policy. The committee may arrange for public forums-fora and referenda among students on matters which the committee is studying.
- c) Maintains liaison with the UWM Administration and the faculties of the colleges on matters of educational policy which are within the jurisdiction of these colleges for the purpose of consulting with them on matters which have been brought to the attention of the committee and which it has studied; and for the further purpose of proposing possible uniform standards in these matters. For the latter purpose the committee may consult with individual representatives of the colleges.

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d) Consults with the colleges, schools, and departments, their executives, and relevant committees, about problems of educational policy which have been brought to the attention of the committee. In these matters the committee shall maintain close liaison with the Academic Program and Curriculum Committee, the Graduate Faculty Committee, and the University Committee.

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Rationale

The members of the APC unanimously voted on October 31, 2024 to amend the APC Charter Section 1 on Membership to make three changes, as follows:

- 1. The first is to add a University Staff member to the APC to benefit from the participation of University Staff.
- 2. The second is to decrease the number of faculty serving by one, from eight to seven. It was suggested to the committee that as the size of the faculty has contracted, making it harder to fill all seats on University committees, the committees should consider their workload and duties, and whether they required the full number of faculty currently listed in their charters. As the APC would be gaining a member under the first provision above, the committee felt it would now be appropriate to reduce faculty serving on the APC by one.
- 3. The final change serves to lessen the restrictive qualifications for the students serving on the APC, as it has also become difficult to fill all of the three seats. We struck the description, "Student memberships include a student member on the Graduate Faculty Committee, an undergraduate student, and another student who is an officer of the Student Association. No more than two students... may be from the same college." This was replaced by the simpler qualifications, "Student membership shall consist of three students, including at least one graduate student and one undergraduate student.
