

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF STUDENT LIFE AND INTERESTS COMMITTEE

Authorization and Membership. The Student Life and Interests Committee (SLIC) was authorized by action of the Faculty of the University of Wisconsin--Milwaukee on November 8, 1956. Faculty members of the Committee during 1956-57 were: H. Kluge, Chairman; C. Wollaeger, Associate Chairman; H. Ahlgren; P. Kramer; R. Norris; C. Rice; D. Shaw; E. Troemel; T. Walton. Student members were: Karen Peters, Donald Rambadt, Donald Smithes, and Jerry Stein.

Functions. The SLIC was given jurisdiction, subject to Faculty direction and control, over all extra-curricular activities and interests of the students. The Committee has decided to divide the whole field of extra-curricular activities and interests of students into six sections, namely: Finance; Fine Arts; Fraternities, Sororities, and Social Life; Publications; Student Government and Student Organizations; and Student Health and Housing.

The Committee has held eight meetings, most of which have been devoted to problems of organization and definition of responsibility. Matters that are appropriate for consideration of the SLIC are considered first by the Committee as a whole and then referred to appropriate sub-committees for investigation and recommendation. Finally, the Committee as a whole acts upon the recommendation of the sub-committee. The following are examples of important problems which are being considered currently by the sub-committees:

1. Advisability of nationalizing some or all fraternities or sororities on the UW--M campus.
2. Adoption of a constitution and the determination of an appropriate form of student government for the needs of UW--M.
3. Preparation of a budget for student activities.
4. A study of the student health and welfare problems and investigation of student health insurance plans.
5. Formulation of policies for student publications.
6. The development of an appropriate fine arts program in such areas as music, art, theater, forensics, etc.

Recommendations of the Committee for Faculty Action. The Committee recommends that the Faculty take the following actions:

1. Approval of the six sub-committees listed after "Functions" above. Each sub-committee shall consist of six members, a faculty chairman who is a member of the SLIC and two faculty members appointed by the Provost (for 1957-58, one to be appointed for a one-year term and one to be appointed for a two-year term, and thereafter each one to be appointed for a two-year term) and three student members to be appointed by the Provost from a list submitted to him by the University Student Government. Each sub-committee shall have a student co-chairman.

2. The following faculty members have been appointed by the Student Life and Interests Committee to serve during 1956-57 on a interim basis pending Faculty authorization. It is recommended that these appointments be confirmed officially as initial appointments.
